It is an amazing opportunity for both MVCTC's secondary and adult education healthcare students.

MVCTC's senior recognition ceremony event marks the transition for students who are completing their studies at MVCTC. This year's event will be held on Friday, May 13 at 7 p.m. at the Wright State Nutter Center.

INTRODUCING THE NEW MIAMI VALLEY CAREER TECHNOLOGY CENTER ADULT EDUCATION REGISTERED NURSE DIPLOMA PROGRAM

The Registered Nurse Diploma Program is a 12-month, 50-week program consisting of classroom, online, laboratory, and clinical experience. Graduates of the RN Diploma Program will be eligible to take the NCLEX-RN Licensure Exam. Students who pass the exam will be prepared to work in various healthcare settings as a Registered Nurse.

Classes will be held Tuesday through Friday, 9:00 am - 3:30 pm, except for clinical days. Students interested in the Registered Nurse Diploma Program must be a licensed LPN.

Classes will start on August 2, 2022, and students will need to enroll by July 14, 2022. Interested students are required to attend an Information Session before applying. The Information Sessions are scheduled for May 18, June 22, or July 6 at 6:30 pm. Learn more at www.mvctc.com/ae/rn.

WORK-BASED LEARNING 2022:

MVCTC offers three opportunities for Work-Based Learning, Internship, Pre-Apprenticeship, and Advanced Placement. This program is a unique opportunity for career technical students to enter a highly skilled occupation in their senior year. In addition, MVCTC has an Ohio State Apprenticeship Council Recognized Pre-Apprenticeship Program. Students receive on-the-job training with a sponsoring employer and related technical instruction at MVCTC for the skills needed to succeed in their career field. The program allows them to earn high school credits, career technical training, real-life work experience, and a paycheck while still in high school.

Currently, 137 seniors at MVCTC are participating in a Work-Based Learning Program. Ninety-eight students are participating as Interns or Pre-Apprenticeships. The average wage for Interns/Pre-Apprenticeship is \$12.61 per hour, and since the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year, they have earned \$639,000. 50,647+ hours worked.



Daniel Nottingham, a senior from Franklin Monroe in the Automotive Technology Program, has been employed with SRS Engine Parts, Inc. in Greenville since March of 2021. He recently won a Gold Medal in the Regional SkillsUSA Automotive Service Technician Competition. He will be representing MVCTC at the Ohio SkillsUSA Competition from May 3-4, 2022.

Dental Assisting Program starts August 15, 2022. In 34 weeks, be prepared for a career as a Dental Assistant, learning to perform various patient care, office, and laboratory duties. Prepare for Radiographer's Certification and Registered Dental Assistant.

Electrician Program starts September 13, 2022. In 68 weeks, be prepared for employment in electrical trades by gaining knowledge to work in residential, commercial, or industrial electrical construction. Prepare for National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) Electrical Certification.

Practical Nursing Program starts May 9, 2022. In 44 weeks, be prepared to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-LPN) and become a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).

Precision Machining Program starts September 13, 2022. In 54 weeks, be prepared for employment in the precision manufacturing industry. Students will also have the opportunity to see the application of robotics and advanced manufacturing and learn FANUC, Kuka, and Yaskawa Robotics. Obtain Robotics Industrial Certification.

Registered Nurse Diploma Program starts August 2, 2022. In 50 weeks, be prepared to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN) and begin a career as a Registered Nurse (RN).

ADULT EDUCATION SHORT-TERM COURSES

Short-Term Courses at MVCTC can give you the tools to stay on top of current trends in the workplace while increasing your earning potential.

Phlebotomy - This is a basic blood draw course. After successfully completing the course, students are prepared to take the NHA Certified Phlebotomy Technician certification exam.

Nurse Aide (STNA) Training - If you want to start a healthcare career, the STNA Training Program is the place to start. An STNA license allows you to get started in a healthcare career. After successfully completing the course, students earn State Tested Nurse Aide (STNA) License through the Ohio Department of Health.

Welding - MVCTC offers short-term Welding courses for adults, including Mig Welding 1 and 2, Shielded Metal Arc Welding 1 and 2, and Tig Welding 1 and 2. All classes are offered in the evenings.

MVCTC's Aspire program offers free workplace education and adult readiness classes at different locations around Montgomery, Greene, and Preble counties to individuals with or without a high school diploma.

Services available: foundational math, reading, and writing skills; Adult Secondary Education/High School Equivalency preparation (GED/HISET); transition services that help students develop essential skills for employment, college or trade school; life skills, employability skills, and computer literacy; workplace education services that are offered in collaboration with an employer to increase the productivity of the workforce; and, distance education classes that enhance learning using technology.

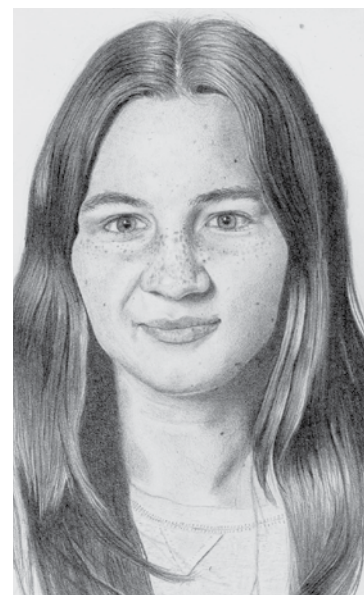

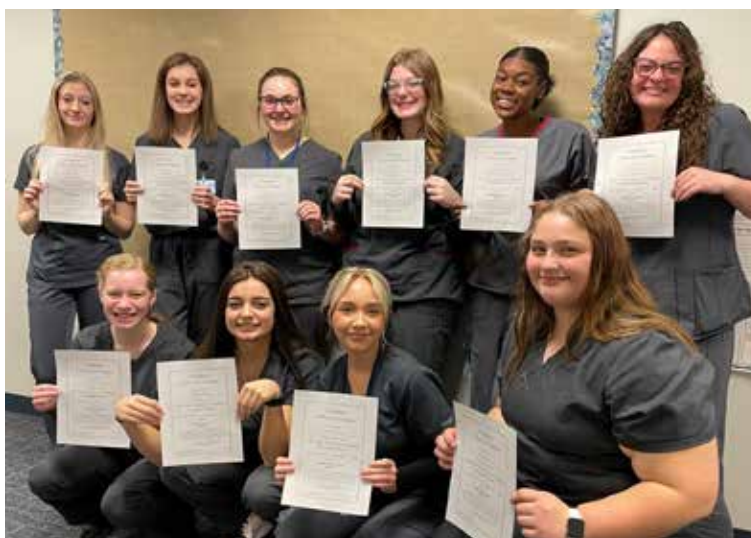

CAMPUS HIGHLIGHTS



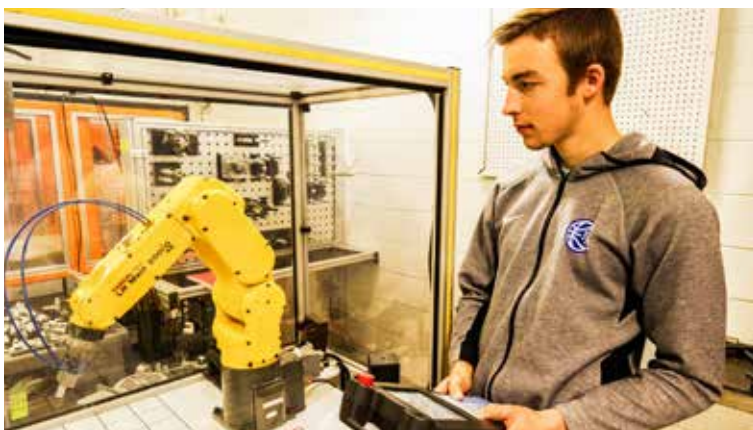
The MVCTC Aviation Maintenance Technician seniors and Aviation Applied Physics students recently learned about aerodynamics in a cross-curricular class taught by Dr. Sarah Fortman, MVCTC Science Instructor. This class is specially designed by MVCTC physics instructors and Aviation Maintenance instructors to provide students with real-world connections between physics and aviation. In this project, students made rubber band-powered model airplanes to demonstrate their knowledge of airframe design. Students spent time optimizing their design by balancing the center of mass of their models to meet the goal of flying the longest distance possible with the longest airtime. Several students flew their models fifteen meters or more with more than ten seconds of airtime. 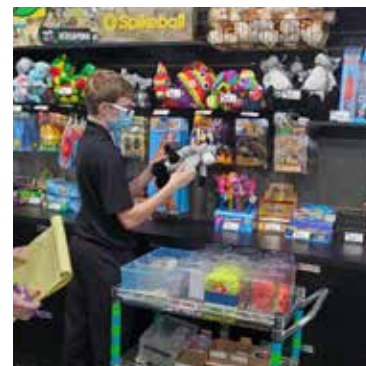


Computer Coding & Web Application students have been working throughout the school year with the NASA Hunch Program on developing an Asteroid Virtual Reality System.
