MVCTC - CONTINUING TO EVOLVE

Fall is known as a time of change; leaves swap their traditional green color for vibrant red, orange, and yellow, the weather becomes brisker, and the daylight seems to fade quicker as dusk arrives earlier each evening.

Like the seasons, MVCTC continues to change as well. The remodeling and expansion project evolves each week as tradesmen and women, a significant portion of who are MVCTC alumni, work to transform our campus into a modern version that will provide necessary careertechnical facilities for decades to come.

Starting in January 2023, MVCTC will open the largest part of the building project. Affectionately known as the "Spine," the two-story portion of the building will come online and house many career-technical programs on the first floor and all of the academic courses on the second floor.

With the addition of this space, MVCTC will be able to open three additional career-technical programs next year. Drones & GIS Technologies, Pre-Law & Legal Studies, and Pre-Engineering will be offered on the main campus starting in 2023-2024. We are excited to expand our total number of career-technical programs to 43. In addition, we will add a second section of the Veterinary Science program for the 2023-2024 school year.

In addition to a successful start on the main campus, we are happy to collaborate with partner districts Miamisburg and Vandalia-Butler this school year to add satellite programs to their communities. At Miamisburg High School, we partnered to add a STEM design and modeling class for grades 9-12. Vandalia-Butler added a Project Lead the Way class for grades 6-8 that focuses on career connections, design, and modeling. The addition of these two new satellite programs brings our total number of satellites to 30.

In closing, I hope you enjoy reading through the remainder of the Fall 2022 Newsletter. There are many student achievements and district updates included! We are proud of our students, proud of our staff, and proud to be MVCTC!!!

Dental Assisting Program

Prepare for a dental assistant career, learning to perform various patient care, office, and laboratory duties. Prepare for Radiographer's Certification and Registered Dental Assistant.

Electrician Program

Prepare for employment in electrical trades by gaining knowledge to work in residential, commercial, or industrial electrical construction. Prepare for National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) Electrical Certification.

HVAC-R Technician Program

Gain knowledge to install, maintain, and repair residential and commercial heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and refrigeration systems. Prepare for ICE and EPA 608 Air Condition & Refrigeration Certification exams.

Heavy Equipment Operations Program

Learn technical knowledge and skills to operate and maintain various heavy equipment. The mission is to prepare students for employment and become leaders in the heavy equipment and construction industry with high standards. Prepare for NCCER (National Center for Construction Education & Research).

Practical Nursing Program

Prepare to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-LPN) and become a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).

Precision Machining Program

Prepare for employment in the precision manufacturing industry. Students will also have the opportunity to see the application of robotics and advanced manufacturing and learn FANUC, Kuka, and Yaskawa Robotics. Obtain Robotics Industrial Certification.

Registered Nurse Diploma

Prepare to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN) and begin a Registered Nurse (RN) career.

ADULT EDUCATION SHORT-TERM COURSES

Short-Term Courses at MVCTC can give you the tools to stay on top of current trends in the workplace while increasing your earning potential.

Phlebotomy - This is a basic blood draw course. After completing the course, students are prepared to take the NHA Certified Phlebotomy Technician certification exam.

Nurse Aide (STNA) Training - If you want to start a healthcare career, the STNA Training Program is the place to start. An STNA license allows you to get started in a healthcare career. After completing the course, students earn State Tested Nurse Aide (STNA) License through the Ohio Department of Health.

Welding - MVCTC offers short-term Welding courses for adults, including Mig Welding 1 and 2, Shielded Metal Arc Welding 1 and 2, and Tig Welding 1 and 2. All classes are offered in the evenings.



MVCTC ASPIRE CLASSES

MVCTC's Aspire program offers free classes for adults seeking to improve academic and workforce skills. Classes are offered at different times and locations around Montgomery, Greene, and Preble counties to individuals with or without a high school diploma.

Services available:

- Foundational math, reading, and writing skills.
- Adult Secondary Education/High School Equivalency (HSE) preparation. HSE options include GED, HiSET, Adult Diploma Program, or 22+ Adult High School Diploma Program.
- Transition services help students develop essential skills for employment, college, or trade school.
- Life skills, employability skills, and computer literacy.
- Workplace education services that are offered in collaboration with an employer to increase the productivity of the workforce.


Youth Connections at MVCTC

MVCTC Youth Connections is an alternative educational program that serves thirty-two school districts in the Miami Valley area. Youth Connections targets students who are:

- Disconnected from school due to non-attendance or an inability to succeed in a regular school setting
- Lacking in credits for their age group
- Deficient in the areas emphasized in the State of Ohio-mandated graduation tests
- Under expulsion for non-violent reasons such as truancy

Youth Connections is based on instruction in a small personal setting with flexibility and a curriculum that

graduate from their partner high school.



Youth Connections has successfully transitioned from the Job Center in Dayton to the Hoke Road campus in the past three months. Since the move, Youth Connections students have visited all career-technical programs, learned about adult education opportunities at MVCTC, and participated in the October student Pumpkin Decorating Contest. As of November 2022, three Youth Connections students have completed their program and will be eligible for graduation from their partner school districts.

Aviation Maintenance Students Sign to join PSA Maintenance Student Pathway Program

Current Aviation Maintenance
Technician seniors Nolan Batterton
(West Carrollton) and Grady Lamb
(Brookville) have signed on with PSA
Airlines for the Maintenance Student
Pathway Program.

According to PSA, "By becoming a Mechanic through the Maintenance Student Pathway Program, you receive a \$2,500 sign-on bonus, a guaranteed interview with a base manager, priority base and training class selection, industry-leading, progressive training programs, and career advancement opportunities."

Once Grady and Nolan graduate, if everything goes well, they will receive a job offer, another \$2,500, and a job that starts at over \$25 an hour. In addition, if they decide to take a job with PSA more than 70 miles from where they live, PSA will give them an additional \$5,000 for moving expenses.

Work-Based Learning 2022-2023

MVCTC offers three opportunities for Work-Based Learning-Internship, Pre-Apprenticeship, and Advanced Placement. The Work-Based Learning Program is a unique opportunity for students to enter a highly skilled occupation in their senior year, earn high school credits, career-technical training, real-life work experience, and a paycheck while still in high school. Currently, 165 seniors at MVCTC are participating in the Work-Based Learning Program. The average wage for Interns/Pre-Apprenticeship is \$13.79 per hour, and since the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year, they have earned \$412,229, and worked 29,877+ hours.


